

Queen Elizabeth Forest Park trail update

Three Lochs Forest Drive – due to delays in the repair of the Drive caused by the poor weather, the Drive will remain closed to vehicles until 9th March 2018 but remains open for walkers and cyclists, car parks are available at the entrance and exit.

Loch Lubnaig Trail and Stank Glen footpath, Strathyre – due to tree felling operations the Loch Lubnaig trail is diverted, this has been extended until the middle of March 18. Walkers can return to the Forest Holiday cabins via the Stank Glen footpath on the north side of the Stank Burn, we recommend cyclists return by their outward route along the forest road due to the steepness of this footpath. There is no access to the Stank Glen footpath on the south side of the Stank Burn. Please see attached map for details.

Loch Chon – we are delighted to announce that the landslip at Faery Knoll has been cleared and this section of path re-opened. There will be a pause in the tree felling on the south shore of Loch Chon, as such we will temporarily re-open this section.

Rowardennan - Phytophthora ramorum, a disease that affects larch trees has been confirmed at Rowardennan, more information on this tree disease can be found at <http://scotland.forestry.gov.uk/supporting/forest-industries/tree-health/phytophthora-ramorum>. Felling of the infected trees will be completed shortly and we ask that people continue to take care when visiting, information on how to protect our forests is available on site plus brushes for cleaning your boots. Beinn an t-Sidhean – due to tree felling operations the lower section of the hill path is diverted, this has been extended until the end of April 2018. Please see attached map for further details.

Leny Woods – Phytophthora ramorum, a disease that affects larch trees has been confirmed in Leny woods, more information on this tree disease can be found at <http://scotland.forestry.gov.uk/supporting/forest-industries/tree-health/phytophthora-ramorum>. Felling of the infected trees has now been completed but visitors should still take care when visiting.
